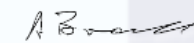

This certificate acknowledges the successful completion of the ISCTP Trainers' Course, recognizing the training, supervision, and support of the implementation of the **Inter-Specialty Training Programme (ISCTP)** in cancer centres. ISCTP enhances the skills of oncology professionals in a patient-centred approach and fills the gap in inter-specialty cancer training.

The trainers represent different specialties and professions working in cancer centres.

The Trainers' course consists of 125 hours of work over 44 weeks, covering training activities of ISCTP. The trainers' course is divided into four units based on the content:

- Contemporary pedagogical approaches and methods in interprofessional education
- Person-centred interprofessional practice in the cancer care continuum
- Content and guidelines for delivery
- Delivery in cancer centres

The trainers course includes 20 hours in-person event, 35 hours of online learning and training, 20 hours of self-study and reflection and 50 hours of on-site training.
